RULES OF THE SHOW

- Objections to any award of Prizes must be made in writing to the Secretary before 4pm on Show Day, accompanied by a deposit of £25 which will be forfeited if the protest is considered frivolous.
- The Judges decision is final.
- It is mandatory for all riders (including judges) to wear a protective helmet manufactured to conform with current approved BSI or European Standard. Such headgear must be worn with the chinstrap correctly and securely fastened at all times whilst mounted on the showground. Hats or helmets requiring covers must be covered with plain, dark coloured silks. The Club accepts no responsibility or liability for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation. No hat cameras are to be worn.
- Horses and Ponies not entering the ring within two minutes of their class being called may be disqualified at the discretion of the Head Steward.
- Vaccinations Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all Equidae (horse and donkeys) attending the Hadleigh Show. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an El vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old. This Rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF and any changes will be notified via the Showing Council and ASAO websites. The current FEI ruling is for a six-monthly booster as opposed to annual; therefore, it is recommended that you check with shows that fall under FEI regulation before entering e.g., Windsor, Hickstead, HOYS etc.
- Foals In-foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born. Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course. We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols, at all times. Vaccinations are subject to local risk assessments by the attending veterinarians. PLEASE NOTE THAT NEITHER VACCINATION CERTIFICATES NOR PASSPORTS SHOULD BE SENT TO THE SHOW OFFICE PRIOR TO THE EVENT. HOWEVER, RANDOM CHECKS MAY BE CARRIED OUT ON THE SHOWGROUND DURING THE SHOW.
- Any animal causing a disturbance may be disqualified at the discretion of the Head Steward.
- All dogs must be kept on leads and are not permitted in any marquees selling food, or any areas with livestock housed in pens.
- The Association and the Executive Committee are committed to ensuring high standards of health, safety and welfare for all those who may be affected by their operations and activities. These standards will be achieved through effective health, safety and welfare management. In discharging these responsibilities, we seek your co-operation.
- The Judges, named at each class heading, have consented and have been appointed to act as
 judges in the classes indicated. The Committee reserves the right to appoint substitutes for
 any who may be unavoidably prevented from attending and all entries are accepted upon

SSA Rosettes and Qualifying Points shall be awarded to Adults & Juniors as 2 sections: the highest placed Adult & Junior Members will receive SSA rosettes to 3rd place, and Qualifying Points down each line. The highest placed Member under 14 on 1st January of the current year will receive a rosette.

In all equitation classes it is the rider and not the horse that is judged and qualifies and there will be no reference to the sex, breeding or conformation of the horse. However, horses should, in the opinion of the judge, have manners suitable for carrying a side saddle. Horses shall be 4 years old or over.

Lead Rein Competitors may compete in a Junior or Open Equitation Qualifying Class. They are not eligible for SSA place rosettes but should be considered for the Turnout Rosette.

Leaders must be correctly dressed.

Competitors enter the ring together and are required by the Judge to walk, trot and canter on the right rein, followed by a change of rein through trot and canter left, before being called into a provisional order.
